- Sunday, June 20th Governor must sign or veto bills or they become effective
- Governor considering mid-July Special Session?
 - Article 10 veto backlash
 - Legislative Branch budget, public funds for lobbying, transgender, voter ID, other issues?

Chamber Actions

- House: SB29 (transgender sports bill), SB10 (taxpayer funded lobbying bill) and SB12 (social media censorship bill) all died in the House when they did not pass by midnight on May 25th.
 - SBIO was postponed until September 18 (Rep. Middleton's birthday)
 - Rep. Middleton had prefiled 4 amendments
- Senate: essentially killed most of the local and consent calendar on May 26th as retribution for the House failing to pass bills, this included HB 639



Chamber Actions

- State Budget approved by Legislature: Conference Committee Report on SB I issued Monday, May 25th and adopted May 27th
 - Requires legislative approval of Federal grant money related to ARPA
 - BUT Governor vetoed Article 10 funding for legislative branch
- SB 7 election bill failed because House Democrats broke a quorum and walked out Sunday night at 10:40pm
 - May 30th was deadline for action on Conference Committee Reports

2nd Special Session

- SB I, Election Reform
 - bans drive-thru and 24-hour voting, extends some early voting hours and gives more power to poll watchers
- SB 6, Bond reform
 - Some criminal defendants required to pay cash to get out of jail.
 Personal bond cannot be granted if the suspect is charged with a violent crime or if the suspect is charged while out on bail.
 - Creates a searchable public safety report system to keep track of defendants, their criminal history and any bail set.



2nd Special Session

- HB 9 Border security
 - Added another \$1.88 billion to for security efforts along the border, including building a wall to the \$1.05 billion set aside in the regular season.
- HB 20 Social media censorship
 - Political viewpoints protected on social media. Bans social media platforms from censoring political views and requires those sites to create a complaint system.
- HB 7 Nuclear waste
 - Prohibits disposing/storing spent fuel rods from nuclear power plants in Texas.
 Legislative proposal to store the nuclear waste -- which can remain radioactive for hundreds of thousands of years



2nd Special Session

- SB 4 Abortion pills
 - Limiting access to abortion-inducing pills. Doctors cannot prescribe them for women who are more than 7 weeks pregnant.
- HB 5 Legislative funding
 - Overrides veto of Article X, which pays for Legislative Reference Library, staff salaries and benefits, etc. Funding was going to run out.
- SB 15 Virtual learning
 - More access to virtual learning for students that passed STAAR exam.
 Provides funding for virtual classes for the next two years.
