#### LEGISLATIVE BRANCH



### Texas Legislature

- Legislative Branch of government in Texas
- Meets every odd-numbered year
- Begins on the second Tuesday in January and lasts 140 days, is called the regular session
  - -Governor may direct the legislature to meet at other times also
  - -Special sessions last no more than 30 days and limited to issues chosen by the Governor



#### Texas House

- I50 members of the state house
- Members of the house of representatives are elected to twoyear terms
- Represent districts of about 167,500 people each (subject to change because of census)



#### Texas House

- Speaker elected on the first day of each regular session
  - —presiding officer
    - maintains order, recognizes members to speak during debate, and rules on procedural matters
  - appoints the chairs and vice chairs of the committees that study legislation
  - decides which other representatives will serve on those committees,
     subject to seniority rules
    - 31 committees, each of which deals with a different subject area, and five committees that deal with procedural or administrative matters for the house
    - Most members serve on two or three different committees.



#### Texas Senate

- 31 members of the state senate
- Senators serve four-year terms
- Serve about 811,000 people each (subject to change)
- Presiding officer is lieutenant governor



#### Texas Senate

- Lieutenant governor
  - -Second-highest ranking officer of the executive branch of government
  - -Four-year term by popular vote in a statewide election.
  - -Appoints Chairs and Vice-Chairs and Committee Members
    - 17 Standing Committees
  - -Not actually a member of the senate.



# Important Legislative Dates

- March 1, 2022 Primary Election
  - -High political motivation of electorate from each party
- November 8, 2022 General Election
  - -Election Day: High political motivation of electorate
- November 14, 2022
  - Prefiling Bills for 88th Session Begins
- January 10, 2023
  - -88th Legislature convenes
- May 29, 2023
  - -Sine Die, 88th Legislature adjourns

  - Letter of Introduction
  - -Follow Up Phone Call
  - Request for Meeting
- To Current Member
- If Contested Election AND the outcome is in doubt, to opposing candidate too.

- ONCE relationship is established
  - –Let SAFE-D know!
  - -Focus on:
