 - » Chair will present Committee Report to Conference
- Follow Roberts Rules of Order for debate
- May inquire of Legislative Counsel



2018 Caucus Results

- Oppose 2.5% Property Tax
 Cap
- 2. Defend Sales Tax Authority
- 3. Authorize New Taxing Entity
- 4. Authorize MIH/Comm. Paramedicine
- 5. Require equal or better service when annex
- 6. Authority to determine who serves w/in ESD

- 7. Consolidate Reporting
- 8. Include Sales Tax in compensation when annex
- Protection for ESD Employee Jobs post annex
- 10. Allow Sales Tax to Exceed2%
- II. Disqualify Service Provider members from board >25K



2019 Caucus Results

- Property Tax Reform exception to rollback and election for Districts that provide disaster response services (20)
- Property Tax Reform eliminate sales tax from exception to rollback (18)
- Consolidate Reporting for ESDs to single location (11)
- Authorize ESDs to repeal exemption for sales tax on electric utilities (9)
- Protect 2604 grant funds and require distribution (7)

- Move Texas Division of Emergency Management to TEEXS (6)
- Authorize ESDs to provide tax abatements to industrial projects (5)
- Move TIFMAS program to TEEXs (4)
- Simplify and expedite reimbursement for disaster funds
 (3)
- Exempt designated HR and Homeland Security documents from public records (2)
- Require ESDs to maintain website, provide exemption for small ESDs (1)

- 7. Monitor annexation changes to protect ESDs from City annexation and loss of revenues (4)

- 11. Clarify ESD control of services provided within ESD boundaries (2)

Caucus Issues



Municipal Annexation & Municipal Issues Caucus

- Apportionment of the ESD's Debt (property tax vs sales tax)?
- Guaranteed Service/Coverage of the Annexed Area by the City?
- Should municipalities already in an ESD be able to withdraw? Arguments for/against?
- Municipal consent to annexation by ESDs?



Sales Tax Caucus

- Should ESDs be allowed to exceed 8.25% in an area?
- Sales tax agreements with other local jurisdictions? How do you keep the peace?
- Repeal of exemption for gas and electric utilities?



Service Provider Relations Caucus

- Should service provider members be allowed to serve on the ESD Board? What level of conflict of interest is too much?
- What level of information should a service provider have to provide the ESD to get funding?
- How should ESDs with Multiple Service Providers be working? Any legislative fixes?



Property Tax Caucus

- What are the good arguments for raising the \$0.10 tax cap? Against?
- Should the cap be a Constitutional cap or set in Chapter 775?
- Since they're levying a property tax, should ESD Commissioners be elected? Arguments for/against?
- What about an entirely new form of District with a higher/unlimited tax cap?
- Should the "ag exemption" be removed for ESD tax purposes?



Government Transparency Caucus

- What should the level of oversight on ESDs be from the State? Who should do the overseeing, if any?
- Should ESDs be required to maintain a website? Arguments for/against?
- Should the audit exemption be adjusted? Should there be any other exceptions to transparency/accountability standards for smaller ESDs?
- Should there be more exemptions related to Homeland Security documents?



ESD Services Caucus

- Should ESDs continue to provide the types of services they do?
- Should ESDs provide non-emergent services, such as:
 - Mobile integrated healthcare/community paramedicine
 - Fire Flow
 - Regulation of Transport Services



Select Caucus on Disaster Response

- Legislature funding of the Disaster Fund
- Fund the expansion of the Texas Regional Search and Rescue System at Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX)
- Financial Recovery Task Force at TDEM to assist Texas communities in recovering as quickly as possible
- Strengthen the trauma system, especially in areas of the state that do not have access to Level I trauma centers, like South Texas.
