The bill amends Chapter 242 of the Local Government Code to allow specific counties with over 370,000 residents and more than six municipalities under 2,000 population can amend jurisdiction agreements to transfer exclusive jurisdiction for subdivision regulation from municipalities to the county.

Remarks:

This bill revises Section 43.0672 of the Local Government Code regarding the consent requirements for municipal annexation at the request of landowners.

Subsection (a) is amended to specify that the governing body of a municipality must negotiate and enter into a written agreement with landowners for service provision, not earlier than 90 days before the

annexation date, regardless of any existing contracts. A new Subsection (d) is added, stating that an agreement allowing for annexation cannot waive the requirements set forth in this section.

It specifically defines full services to include police and fire protection, emergency medical services, and the necessary infrastructure such as water and wastewater facilities, streets, and other publicly owned services required for effective municipality operation. Municipalities are prohibited from charging landowners for any service costs and cannot require landowners to fund services or improvements linked to the provision of municipal services.

enforcement, while on duty or in training exercises. The Bill replaces the term "nonroutine" with a more explicit description of qualifying activities and adds a temporal element requiring that the medical event occurs within eight hours of the end of their shift.

Bill mandates that peace officers must render first aid for an injured person as per the specifications of Article 2B.0301 of the Code of Criminal Procedure but provides an exemption from this obligation if the act of providing aid would pose a likely risk of serious bodily injury to themselves or others, or if they are incapacitated due to injury. Bill amends Section 1701.2551(b) to ensure that peace officer training includes explicit instructions about the prohibition of excessive force, the duty to intervene to prevent unlawful use of force by fellow officers.

The bill mandates that Texas Southern University create comprehensive policies related to the handling of misdemeanor offenses punishable by fines and to develop training materials focused on the use of force. Additional provisions include the requirement for specific officer training, limitations on defenses in court regarding officer misconduct, and the waiver of sovereign immunity for claims arising under Chapter 118.
