Remarks:

The bill introduces Section 556.0056 to the Government Code, which imposes new restrictions on the use of public funds by political subdivisions for lobbying activities. Specifically, political subdivisions are prohibited from using public funds to hire individual lobbyists or pay nonprofit

organizations that hire lobbyists. Exceptions to these restrictions allow for certain actions by officers and employees, such as providing information to legislators and engaging in advocacy, as long as these actions do not require lobbyist registration. Additionally, if a political subdivision violates this section, taxpayers or residents can seek injunctive relief, and they can recover reasonable attorney's fees if they prevail.

#### Remarks:

This bill addresses the preparation, prevention, and mitigation of wildfires in Texas by introducing several key provisions. It defines the Texas A&M Forest Service in the government code and mandates the creation of a statewide database by the forest service to track firefighting equipment available across the state. The bill increases the appropriations cap for the volunteer fire department assistance fund from \$30 million to \$40 million, with an explicit allocation of at least 10% for high-risk volunteer fire departments. The bill sets stringent standards for electrical power lines related to oil and gas development. House Committee Sub stripped the increase in assessments f or the VFD assistance fund.

Bill creates Chapter 44 within the Utilities Code, establishing a Texas Grid Security Commission composed of representatives from various government sectors and stakeholders in the electric utility industry. The bill mandates the commission to issue an annual non-classified report on grid threats and mitigation measures and must prepare a comprehensive plan detailing weatherization, infrastructure upgrades, and resilience standards for municipalities.

#### Remarks:

This bill amends the Local Government Code by adding Section 43.1057, which outlines a new process for municipalities to annex areas adjacent to railroad rights-of-way. Specifically, it allows municipalities to annex an additional area alongside an initially annexed area as long as the new area is adjacent to a railroad property that runs parallel to the municipality's boundaries.

To move forward with this annexation, all property owners within the area to be annexed must agree to the annexation. The bill provides clarity on the definition of what constitutes an adjacent and contiguous area in relation to the annexing municipality, ensuring that areas located next to the annexed area are recognized as contiguous.

This bill establishes a database of firefighting equipment available statewide at the Forest Service. The bill defines "fire department" to include volunteer fire departments and emergency services districts.

Under the newly established Section 418.059, the bill mandates that the Forest Service develop and maintain a real-time inventory of all firefighting equipment across the state. This database will include critical information such as a description of the firefighting equipment owned by each fire department, their contact information, and the ability to search by both location and equipment type. All fire departments, including volunteer and emergency services

districts, will have access to the database.

Remarks:

Key modifications include redefining eligible residential developments to encompass those occupied or intended for occupancy by low and moderate-income individuals, discarding the previous threshold of 90% occupancy. New sections enforce compliance with open meetings and record laws. Introduces defined territory limits for housing finance corporations based on sponsoring

local government boundaries and establishes conditions under which they may operate outside these areas with approvals from local governments. The bill places stricter conditions on bond issuance. Notably, the requirements for tax exemptions tied to multifamily residential developments now include strict adherence to designated income levels with auditing procedures.

#### Remarks:

This bill amends the Insurance Code and Government Code to enhance the funding and support mechanisms for the Rural Volunteer Fire Department Assistance Program by modifying the assessment process for insurers. Key changes include the removal of the previous cap on the assessment, a requirement that at least 10% of the appropriations for each state fiscal year be specifically allocated to assist volunteer fire departments in high-risk areas for large wildfires, and a provision allowing any unallocated funds from this 10% to be used for other types of assistance requests by eligible departments. The bill does not increase funding for the fund.


